





Dear Governor Shapiro and Lieutenant Governor Davis,

We, the undersigned, advocates for safer communities across Pennsylvania, submit the following letter to express our deep disappointment and dissatisfaction with the substantial defunding of community Violence and Intervention Prevention (VIP) grants in the Pennsylvania Budget for FY2023/2024.

Pennsylvania's rural, suburban, and urban areas continue to grapple with the public health crisis of gun violence. In the last two years, firearm homicides have climbed in communities from Reading to Erie, from Allentown to Philadelphia, reaching nearly 1,000 a year.

Last year's PA Budget allocation of \$105M for FY2022/2023 provided the critical resources necessary to help us do the difficult work of keeping our communities safe. However, statewide needs far exceed available funding. A 61% reduction in VIP grants (\$65M) for FY2023/2024 will put communities throughout Pennsylvania at risk.

VIP grants provide a public health approach to reducing shootings and gun homicides by forging relationships with people at the center of gun violence in our communities. These programs support people at the highest risk of being victims or perpetrators. These programs include, but are not limited to:

- Credible messengers, who mediate disputes that could potentially lead to retaliatory shootings.
- Pre-responders who disrupt violence by keeping youth positively engaged year-round
- Hospital-based violence interruption programs engage survivors of gun violence while they're hospitalized to connect them with case managers and social service providers.
- Group violence interventions, which are collaboratives between community leaders, social service providers, and law enforcement, identify those with the highest violence risk, and intervene to provide the necessary support.
- Victim services help prevent retaliation by supporting those who've experienced violence.
- Targeted workforce development efforts that combine trauma-informed care with engaging high-risk individuals in the economy.

It is fatal to defund the critical lifeline of support communities throughout our Commonwealth desperately depend on. We need sustained investment in violence reduction programs to help realize safer communities. It is critical for state leaders to – at the least – restore the FY2023/2024 allocation to \$105M, and, ideally expand funding. Given the great demand for these services, coupled with the present gridlock within the General Assembly relating to the budget, we implore you to explore any and all options (Both executive and legislative) at your disposal to deliver the necessary resources to help us continue to keep our respective communities safe.
